Three new aesthetically designed buildings have been added to the Tezpur University campus. The office of the Vice-Chancellor has recently shifted to one of the buildings (photo above). The Departments of Chemical Sciences and Energy have moved into the building allotted to them.

Other offices which have shifted include those of the Registrar, the Controller of Examinations, the Finance Officer, and the Deputy Director, Training and Placement.

Construction work is going on in full swing at Tezpur University.

Building projects include a four hundred seat boys' hostel, a hundred and fifty seat girls' hostel, a state-of the-art auditorium, a new library building, and an additional guest house as well as Academic Buildings V and VI. The internal roads of the university have been further developed.

Expansion plans include the construction of an Academic Council Hall, a Students' Activity Centre, a married scholars' hostel, more residential units for faculty and staff, a Central Sophisticated Instrument Facility, and a Women's Centre.

# Eleventh Annual Meet

The 11th Annual Meet of Tezpur University began on February 28 and ended on March 2. The Annual Meet also marked the culmination of various interdepartmental competitions in such sports as football, volleyball, basketball, and table tennis that began in September 2007.

The inaugural function began with the lighting and carrying of the Olympic torch by the captains of the various sports teams and by the faculty incharge, Mr Bhabesh Nath, as well as by the Sports Officer, Mr Pankaj Borah. A highlight of the function was the march past competition in which the four University hostels participated. Bordoichila Chatri Niwas came first while Brahmaputra Chatra Niwas was adjudged runnersup. Mr S K Alam, Vice-President, Tezpur District Sports Association, a noted sports commentator and administrator, was felicitated on the occasion by Professor M M Sarma, Head, Dept of English and Foreign Languages, on behalf of the Vice Chancellor. Professor Sarma also hoisted the flag. The oath was administered to the various participants by Dr Mrimoy Sarma, Dean. Students' Welfare.

The Annual Meet provided students of Tezpur University with an opportunity to display their skills and talents in sports and athletics, and in literary and cultural activities. The sports competitions and events organized were, among others, weightlifting, body building, marathon race, arm wrestling, kabbadi, 100, 200, 800 and 1500 metres race, relay race, shot-put, javelin, and discuss throw, carrom board, lawn tennis, chess and long jump. The best male athlete award went to Aniket Chakraborty, a student of the B.Tech. (Mech) programme. Bharati Munda of the Dept of Cultural Studies was adjudged the best female athlete. Ranjan Das (B. Tech), Jayanta Dutta (MBA), Nayan Maity (Mathematical Sciences) were Best Player in basketball, volleyball, and football respectively. The Man of the Match prize in the cricket final went to Durlav Taye (MBA) while the Man of the Series prize went to Nitish Kumar (M.Tech). Moushin Muataq (MBBT) was adjudged the Best Bowler. In arm wrestling Mohendra Mohan Rajiunj and Irina Pegu were declared Champion of Champions in the men and women's groups respectively. The Marathon champion was Safiqur Rahman (Chemical Sciences), the Strongman of Tezpur University was Prince Goswami (Mathematical Sciences). Dipranjal Keot (MBA, Part-time) was declared Mr Tezpur University.

Recitation, short story writing, caption writing were some of the literary competitions that were held. Gunjana Dey (EFL) was given the Best Competitor prize in the Literary Events. The Dept of Business Administration and the Dept of Physics won the wall magazine and the collage making competitions respectively. In the singing competition the best singer was Ananya Bonjoystna (Chemical Sciences) while Moussumi Bhattacharya (MCA) emerged as the best dancer.

The meet ended on March 2 with a cultural programme in which well-known Assamese singer Jitul Sonowal and Native Rules, a rock band from Shillong, performed. Dr Mrimoy Sarma, Dean, Students' Welfare, and Mr Pankaj Borah, Sports Officer coordinated the Annual Meet.

Writers' Association. Dr A K Khan and Dr P K Singh, resource persons from Rau's Study Circle were also present at the function.


During the month and half long programme, a number of in house resource persons as well as experts from other universities coached the participants in various aspects of civil services training.

### **Placements**

Tezpur University's Training & Placement Cell is manned by its Deputy Director, Mr Rajeev K. Doley. The placement exercise for the current year began in January 2008 and is still continuing. Twenty two companies have responded with their willingness to participate in the placement activity.

While some companies desired to visit the University campus for recruitment of students, a number of others expressed their inability to come up to Tezpur. Therefore, for them the tests/interviews were/are to be held in Guwahati.

The students of the University also participated in the common placement events organized by the North-East Professional Institutes' Forum (NEPIF) in Guwahati.

The companies/organizations that have already

visited the University campus for recruiting students since January 2008 are Industrial Development Bank of India (IDBI), Aircell, Wipro and PRADAN.

## **University News**

### Tezpur University Entrance Examination 2008

Some of the busiest people on campus this semester have been the Tezpur University Entrance Examination Committee 2008 (TUEE 2008) members consisting of Dr R C Deka (Chairperson), Dr D C Baruah (Vice Chairperson), Mr M Mandal (Member Secretary), Mr S I Singh (Member) and Dr S K Ray (Member). Thev deserve appreciation for meticulous planning and the sustained hard work they have put in to make the entrance examinations a smooth affair. Conducting the TU Entrance Examinations involves a number of tasks. It begins with designing the prospectus and posters and arranging the various examination centers. Then all-important is the coordinating the setting of question papers and evaluation of answer scripts within a tight time frame. In conducting the examinations with the help of Tezpur University faculty, support staff recruited local help, there are a number of logistics challenges as well.

The **Tezpur** University **Entrance** Examinations (TUEE 2008) were held on 30, 31 May and 1 June. This year 2788 candidates appeared in entrance examinations to the 19 programmes offered by Tezpur University. The entrance examinations were held in 14 separate centres located in the Northeast region and other parts of India. This year the University has made an effort to cast its net more widely. New examinations centres were introduced at Hyderabad, Delhi and Kolkata. The initial response has been gratifying. The results of the entrance examinations will be declared on June 20.

### **Health Centre news**

Health Centre of Tezpur University has been functioning since 1995. It provides health care services to students, faculty and staff of Tezpur University. The Health Centre at present operates under the supervision of run by Tezpur University's own experienced Medical Officer, Dr D K Goswami, and recent recruit, Dr (Mrs.) Jonali Sarma Goswami, who joined in January 2008. The medical staff consists of a pharmacist, a laboratory technician and a nurse. The Health Centre offers OPD services but four indoor beds are also available for initial care in emergency cases. A Medical Officer is available round the clock for emergency cases.

The facilities available in the Health Centre have been further increased. While the Health Centre has is own ECG machine and autoanalyser, an Ultrasound scanner was recently purchased. Specialists in disciplines like Radiology, Paediatrics, Obstetrics and Gynaecology have been engaged to make weekly visits for the benefit of the University community. From 28 March 2008 onwards the Health Centre conducted its Annual Health Checkup programme for the employees of the University.

### **NSS organizes Health Camp**

The National Service Scheme (NSS) cell of Tezpur University organized a Health Camp at Panchmile L P School on 16 February. Dr Motiur Rahman, child specialist, conducted a free health check-up. Professor Mihir K. Chaudhuri, Vice-Chancellor, visited the camp. Professor B K Danta, Dean, Social Sciences and Humanities, Mr Rajiv Doley, Officer on Special Duty and Deputy Placement Officer, Mr Rabin Deka, Lecturer, Department of Sociology, Mr Pankaj Borah, Sports Officer, Mr Uttam Pegu Lecturer, Department of Mass Communication and Journalism, and Mr Amiya Das, guest lecturer, Department of Sociology accompanied the students. Dr Shankar Deka, Reader, Department of Food Processing and faculty-in charge coordinated the NSS programme.
