



TU marches ahead amidst COVID19

With the country going through unusual times because of the COVID19 pandemic, it is heartening to see that the Tezpur University (TU) Community has contributed towards fighting this problem. The biggest challenge of going completely online in the teaching-learning process was handled with ease for the benefit of the students' community. This could be achieved with relentless support of all the members of the extended TU family and the pedagogical activities remained intact within the prescribed online parameters. Another high point of the initiative was the support to the medical fraternity in the form of developing new and convenient devices for various laboratory purposes of diagnosis as well as treatment of the disease. One prime example is the 'face shield' the medical professionals can use while attending COVID19 patients. Also, the portable ventilator – an instrument for helping patients, especially in these trying times has been a major contribution. Further, some of our research scholars have been deputed for training the medical staff in collection, testing and analysis of the samples of suspected COVID patients. Our premises were also allowed for setting up of screening camps for people returning from other states when lock down was declared.

Several other developments were also going on even during this period. A special cricket pitch is being developed in the main sports field of the university, with sponsorship of Assam Cricket Association. Also, two brand new basketball courts are being constructed. These activities are expected to definitely enhance the sports enthusiasm of the TU fraternity in the coming days to the optimum possible level. Further, in the month of January, the Mass Communication and Journalism Department organized three youth-related workshops consecutively with support of Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD) in 'offline' mode with a high degree of participation.

One important event of the year is the convocation in January addressed by the Prime Minister Sri Narendra Modi in online mode. The PM inspired and encouraged the students' community to dedicate themselves towards an all-round development of the nation.

In short, it can be said that the period was satisfactory to the optimum level for the university community within the overall pandemic situation. Thus, the TU fraternity deserves strong encouragement for the efforts.

The Editorial team for the Newsletter has left no stones unturned to include each and every important development for the university during this timeframe. However, one or two events may be left only by omission. We hope that this version is adequately reflecting all the happenings and activities of the university properly for the given period.

Tezpur University has progressed resolutely at a steady pace during 2021 even as our state of Assam and the rest of the country continued to battle the Covid 19 pandemic. The University community has not only engaged in research and academic activities but has also sincerely invested in improving the life conditions of the community residing in its vicinity.

The faculty have brought laurels to the university through research, project grants innovations leading to technologies with social impact. The faculty of the University have developed two uniquely designed face shields for medical staff to fight against Covid 19 with the help of 3D printing technology. The University also developed low-cost aerosol boxes and a Centrifuge Machine for medical staff. These were distributed to the Tezpur Medical College and Hospital (TMCH) in Assam and Tomo Riba Institute of Health and Medical Sciences (TRIHMS) in Arunachal Pradesh. The students of the Department of Electrical Engineering have also collaborated with their faculty to develop a low-cost portable ventilator which has become an essential instrument for life support during the pandemic. The faculty of the University contributed generously, including at least their one-day salary to the Chief Minister relief fund.

In the academic arena, Tezpur University is taking incremental steps to realize the objectives of quality education by implementing various suggestions put forth by the National Education Policy 2020. The flexibility, inclusion and diversity in the curriculum and pedagogy at Tezpur University will be further enhanced in line with provisions of NEP 2020.

I look forward to greater academic excellence for the University in the coming days and extend my best wishes to the students, faculty and staff.

RIME Minister, Shri Narendra Modi addressed the 18th Convocation of Tezpur University, Assam held on January 22, 2021 through video conferencing. Governor of Assam Prof. Jagdish Mukhi, Union Education Minister Dr. Ramesh Pokhriyal 'Nishank' and the then Chief Minister of Assam Shri Sarbananda Sonowal were also present on the occasion.

Speaking on the occasion, the Prime Minister addressed over 1200 students. He believed that what the students learnt at Tezpur University will accelerate the progress of Assam and progress of the

country. He said the sentiment contained in the university anthem which was written by Bharat Ratna Dr. Bhupen Hazarika resonates with the great history of Tezpur. The Prime Minister quoted a few lines from the University Anthem, which reads—

'अग्निगड्र स्थापत्य, कलियाभोमोरार सेतु निर्माण,

ज्ञान ज्योतिर्मय.

सेहि स्थानते बिराजिसे तेजपुरवि श्वविद्यालय'

That is, Tezpur University is situated in a place where there is architecture like Agnigarh, where there is a Kalia-Bhomora bridge, where there is a light of knowledge. Eminent personalities like Bhupen Da, Jyoti Prasad Agarwala and Bishnu Prasad Rabha are identified with Tezpur.

Addressing the students, he urged them to spread the glory of Tezpur across India and all over the world, take Assam and North East to new heights of development and asked the students to take full advantage of the possibilities created by the Government's efforts at development of the North East especially in sectors like connectivity, education and health.

The Prime Minister remarked that Tezpur University is also known for its Innovation Centre. These grassroots innovations are giving momentum to Vocal for Local and are being used to solve local problems, opening new doors of development. He lauded the innovations of Tezpur University like low-cost technology to provide clean drinking water, pledge taken to convert Waste into Energy in every village, inexpensive and effective technology related to biogas and organic fertilizers, campaign to preserve the Biodiversity and Rich Heritage of North East, documentation of the languages of the North East tribal society which are in danger of extinction, preservation of centuries-old wood-carved art at Batadrava Than,





Nagaon, digitization of Assam's books and papers written during colonial times.

The Prime Minister also elaborated on the concept of Atma Nirbhar Abhiyan. He explained that while this movement is about change in resources, physical infrastructure, technology and economic and strategic might, the biggest transformation is in the realm of instinct, action and reaction which is in sync with the mood of today's youth.

The Prime Minister said today's young India has a distinctive way of taking on challenges. He used the recent performance of the young Indian cricket team in Australia to illustrate his point. The Indian cricket team faced so many challenges. However, they overpowered a better team with their talent and temperament. The Prime Minister stressed that this stellar performance of our players is important not just from the point of view of the sports field but gave important life lessons from the performance. First, we should have faith and confidence in our ability; second, a positive mindset begets positive results. Third and most important lesson is – if one is facing two options, one safe and the other is an option

of a difficult victory, one must surely explore the option of victory. There is no harm in occasional failure and one should not refrain from taking the risks. We need to be proactive and fearless. If we overcome the fear of failure and unnecessary pressure, we will emerge fearless. This new India, confident and dedicated to goals, is evident not only in the cricket field but everyone is a part of this picture.

The self-confidence and absence of fear in trading the uncharted path and young energy has strengthened the country in its fight against Corona. India overcame the initial apprehensions and showed that with resolve and resilience, resources are not far behind. India took fast, proactive decisions instead of compromising with the situation and effectively fought with the virus.

The Prime Minister also listed digital infrastructure enabling direct benefit transfer, fintech digital inclusion, world's largest banking inclusion, world's largest toilet construction movement, largest movement of providing tap water in every household, world's largest health insurance scheme and world's largest vaccination drive as testimony to today's India's attitude, unafraid of experimentation for solution and not averse to undertake large-scale projects. These projects are benefitting Assam and the Northeast.

Speaking of the possibility of future universities which might be fully virtual, providing students and faculty to be part of any university of the world, the Prime Minister emphasized the need for a regulatory framework for such transformation. He pointed out that the new National Education Policy is a step in this direction which encourages maximum use of technology, multi-disciplinary education and flexibility.

The Prime Minister called upon the students of Tezpur University to help in fulfilling these goals. He said that, after finishing their formal education, they not only work for their future but for the future of the country. He advised them to keep their ideals high which will protect them from the vicissitudes of life. He said the next 25-26 years are important for them as well as their country and expressed the hope that the students will take the country to new heights.



Tezpur University students design special 'portable ventilator' to fight COVID-19

The nation fights the coronavirus pandemic; thanks to the doctors, nurses, ambulance drivers, laboratory technicians, etc. Amid the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, Tezpur University students have come up with an innovation that comes as a ray of hope!

The Department of Electrical Engineering, Tezpur University has undertaken an initiative to design a portable ventilator, an essential instrument for patients who are unable to sustain the level of ventilation necessary to maintain the gas exchange functions. This is in response to the prevailing situation of Covid-19 and subsequent shortage of ventilators.





The initiative was part of a project, awarded as the 'Best Innovative Engineering Idea' under the banner of Prof. Aparna Kumar Padmapati Annual Scholarship from Assam Engineering College (AEC) Class 88 Foundation for year 2020-21, an initiative of the alumni of Assam Engineering College who passed out in 1988, popularly known as AEC Class 88 Foundation.

The team comprised of a group of Electrical Engineering students, with Mr. Bihung Muchahary, Mr. Aniket Raj, Mr. Manish Kumar and Ms. Ankita Das who are working in the project under the guidance of Mr. Chiranjit Adhikary, Ex-Guest Faculty, Dept. of Electrical Engineering and Ms. Firdausa Ahmed, Guest Faculty member of Dept. of Electrical Engineering and the project is supervised by Prof. Soumik Roy, Head, Department of Electrical Engineering.

"The purpose of the project is to design a portable mechanical

ventilator by automating the operation of 'Ambu Bag' with volume control ventilation which can be used in respiratory failure", explained Prof. Soumik Roy.

An "Ambu Bag" is a hand-held device which is commonly used to provide positive pressure ventilation to patients who are not breathing adequately or have severe problem in breathing. "Another important objective of the project is to implement Internet of things (IoT) based features like monitoring of patient activity and controlling parameters of ventilator through an App".

It further adds, the prototype designed is sufficiently economic and by using IoT as a remote controlling feature, one can control and monitor the ventilatory parameters through devices like mobile phones, tabs and computers. Besides, it will prevent both the clinicians and the doctors from getting infected from airborne transmission," Prof. Roy further added.

It may be mentioned that the machine is cost effective and would be available at an affordable price costing between Rs. 8,000- Rs.15,000 depending on the features of the machine.

An online Training on Basic Use of ICT Tools in Teaching Screencasting software was organized by the Teaching Learning Centre, Tezpur University from 27 January to 02 February 2021 under PMMMNMTT Scheme, Ministry of Education, Goyt, of India.

The programme was an attempt to introduce basic ICT tools in teaching to the teachers of higher education who use Assamese and English bilingual methods of teaching. Online Interdisciplinary Refresher Course on Curriculum and Pedagogy organized

Tezpur University Teaching Learning Centre (TLC) organized an online Interdisciplinary Refresher Course on Curriculum and Pedagogy under PMMMNMTT Scheme, Ministry of Education from 15 February to 01 March 2021.

Teaching Learning Centre has been conducting Refresher Courses and other training Programs for teachers of higher education as per PMMMNMTT mandate since 2016. Keeping in view the norms regarding COVID19 Pandemic, the proposed Refresher Course was conducted in online mode. The Teaching Learning Centre, Tezpur University invited faculty members of Universities, Colleges and Institutes of higher education for participation in the workshop. The applicants were shortlisted as per UGC and GoI norms, due to the restriction of limited 100 seats. The shortlisted candidates had to pay a token amount of Rs. 700.00(non-refundable) within stipulated time. E-certificates were awarded to the participants after attending all the sessions and proper submission of all assignments.

Liang spoke on the topic 'Women and Leadership in Contemporary Times'. She told a series of stories and her first story revolved around an Indo-Chinese dance called Lion dancing which is performed by the Chinese people but had to face a lot of problems, but they challenged it until it became acceptable in the whole world. Her next story revolves around Chirang district and the challenges faced by the women there. She also spoke women kabaddi which is a part of women empowerment in the village, and another story revolving around Sifung girls giving training to boys on how to play traditional musical instruments and on the various works done by the organization to develop women-leadership in the grassroots level.

Interactive session on LGBTQ movement in Assam organized

On the occasion of Women's *Week* celebration, an interactive session on LGBTQ movement in Assam was organized by the Chandraprabha Saikiani Centre for Women Studies, Tezpur University on 15 March, 2021. Milin Dutta, LGBTQ *a*ctivist, was the resource person for this session who shared his journey and how he overcame all the hurdles and fought with the norms of the society to make his mark. He was also one of the torch-bearers of the first-ever queer collective in the North-East known as the XUKIA, which works towards LGBTQ+ issues, especially in the North-East.

Webinar on 'Communist Party of China's Foreign Policy: Of Regime Survival, Status and Power' held

The Department of Foreign Language organized a webinar on The Communist Party of China's Foreign Policy: Of Regime Survival, Status and Power on 22 March 2021 to enhance the understanding of Chinese foreign policy. The speaker for the occasion was Dr.Jabin T. Jacob who is Associate Professor at the Department of International Relations and Governance Studies at the Shiv Nadar University, India and Adjunct Research Fellow at the National Maritime Foundation, New Delhi. He was formerly Fellow and Assistant Director at the Institute of Chinese Studies, Delhi and Associate Editor of the journal China Report.

Speaking on the occasion Dr. Jacob emphasized that what is generally understood as Chinese foreign policy is primarily the foreign policy of the Communist Party of China (CPC). China runs its foreign policy somewhat differently from most other nations leading to subordination of national interests to regime interests. Thus, consolidating and strengthening itself in power are the foremost priorities of the CPC and foreign policy is one tool among many for this purpose. Related to regime survival are the quest for international status and the deployment of power abroad. Dr. Jacob's presentation discussed these aspects while offering examples from Chinese foreign policy to put forward some implications for bilateral and multilateral engagement with China.

National Seminar On 'Current Literary Trends, Practices And Status Of Assamese Literature' Organised




Department of MCJ, Tezpur University hosts three-day event on mental and emotional wellness for youth
