Title of the Course: History of Assamese Book Course Code: AS 503 Course Teacher: Sanjib Deka Medium of Instruction: English

This paper aims to encourage students to gain knowledge on the history of Assamese books which includes manuscripts and printed texts. Hem Saraswati ushered in the tradition of writing book in Assamese in early fourteenth century and the tradition, both writing and scribing manuscript, persisted till mid twentieth century. With the arrival of the Baptist Missionaries, the nineteenth century Assam witnessed the 'coming of the book'. This paper will enable the students to learn the impact of print and the standardisation of language, the history of Assamese books as well as literature from fourteenth century onwards. The paper will also impart skills like reading medieval manuscript, preservation, archiving old manuscripts and printed texts, proof reading and editing.
