DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WORK

The Department of Social Work, Tezpur University was established in 2014 to respond to the dearth of good Social Work schools and trained social work professionals in the North East Region (NER) of India. The Department follows a rigorous theoretical and field-based pedagogy with special focus on the issues of the NER. For now the Department offers Master of Arts in Social Work and PhD in Social Work degrees which follows a creditbased continuous evaluation system.

The curriculum is designed to train students with the generic approach of social work, which leads to the conduct of research in emerging areas of social work profession and issues related to the NER. Through the fieldwork practicum (a crucial and integral part of social work training), the students are exposed to different economic, sociocultural and political realities of the region. Additionally, the students are exposed to social welfare various programmes implemented at the grassroots level through the community, NGOs and government settings. The students are also encouraged to carry out internship and volunteering activities during the semester breaks in profit and non-profit sectors and other various government departments.

They work independently for a month, explore areas of interest, apply learnings developed in the last three semesters, plan strategic ways of intervention, and develop analytical skills. Block placement is also an opportunity for students to gain perspective about professional responsibilities and self- evaluation before attending any job placement. Rural Camp is an integral part of practice in the third semester which is held for five days. This year students were taken to a community based livelihood organization in Barpeta District of Assam. Our students also conduct independent research upon various issues which help them comprehend the different social issues while working in corporate and development sectors.

Besides academics, our students actively participate in co-curricular and extracurricular activities which have contributed towards their holistic personality development and professional growth. Greetings from the Department of Social Work, Tezpur University.

It is an honour to be writing this note for the Placement Brochure 2023-25. The batch 2023-25 is a vibrant and dynamic cohort of students. It's a batch of 19 students with 18 hailing from different parts of Assam and one student from Kerala. The students came into social work from different academic programmes. From Chemistry to History, we have a range of varied undergraduate backgrounds.. This made the batch academically diverse and truly interdisciplinary. The social work training has equipped them with interpersonal skills embedded in socia work principles, values and ethics.

The M.A. programme in Social Work has a rigorous field work component. The field work takes place concurrently with the classroom transactions. The students go to the field twice a week- on Mondays and Thursdays. In the first and the second semesters, students are placed in open communities, both rural and urban. Students are expected to deliver the community profile, understand the community, assess needs, plan and execute appropriate intervention strategies. They also undertake casework and group work as field interventions. In the third Semester, students are placed in agencies where they get an experience of social work administration, project management, project implementation and other aspects of organizational interventions. This batch of students were placed in hospital settings, school setting, deaddiction centres, mental health setting and community setting. During the fourth semester, the students did a month long block field work placement in any agency of their choice. During the rural camp, students experience absolute rural immersion at a select site for a week.

The MA theory curriculum is designed so as to complement the field work. The social work methods of community organization, case work and group work are taught during the first and second semesters while development administration, and specialized areas are addressed during the third and fourth semesters. There is a constant effort to relate theory with practice and the students develop praxis under the constant supervision of their department supervisors. The component of individual conference and group conference help the students to present field specific issues, creatively seek solutions and design strategies.

This batch of students have shown dedication and commitment in their field work. We have received excellent feedback from the various agencies that they were placed in. At the Assam Cancer Care Foundation, social work trainees conducted several cancer screening camps at the communities. At Collegiate high school, the social work trainees that were placed addressed many sensitive issues that the students were facing. They exhibited excellent community mobilising and networking skills. A few students from this batch were also involved at an entrepreneurial project of manufacturing sustainable sanitary pads at a nearby community.

I am proud to say that this batch of students are dedicated, sincere and committed. They have great problem-solving skills and high work ethics. They are open to learning and adaptive to varied situations. I am confident they will be an asset to any organization they work in. I would like to welcome you to the Department of Social Work to participate in the placement processes and interact with our students.
