About the Speaker:

Prof. Bhikhu Parekh, Eminent Political Scientist/Philosopher



Professor Bhikhu Parekh has graduated from the University of Bombay and obtained his PhD from the London School of Economics in 1966. He has been teaching at the University of Hull since 1964 and is currently an Emeritus Professor at that university. He has been a Visiting Professor at several universities including McGill, Harvard, Institute of Advanced Study in Vienna, the University of Pennsylvania, and University of Pompeu Fabra, Barcelona. He delivered Litowitz Lecture at Yale University in 2003 and was recently invited as Distinguished Visitor by the Cardozo Law School in New York. He was Vice-Chancellor of the University of Baroda from 1981-1984. He is the author of several widely acclaimed books in political philosophy, including *Rethinking Multiculturalism* published by Harvard University Press, U.S.A. in 2000. He is a Fellow of the British Academy, and past president of the Academy of Learned Societies in the Social Sciences.

Professor Parekh is also active in British political life. He was for five years Deputy Chairman of the Commission for Racial Equality and chaired the Commission on the Future of Multi-Ethnic Britain, whose report (called the Parekh Report) was published in 2000. He received the BBC's Special Lifetime Achievement Award for Asians in November 1999 and was appointed to the House of Lords in March 2000. He received Sir Isaiah Berlin Prize for Lifetime Contribution to Political Philosophy, and Padma Bhushan from the president of India.
