Abstract

After eight months of the standoff in Ladakh, India and China have agreed to disengage. Unlike previous standoffs, Ladakh witnessed the killing of soldiers from both sides in the deadly clash thereby violating all the border agreements signed to maintain peace sad tranquility along the border. This talk aims to discuss future India – China engagement, given the rising mutual distrust, power dilemma, and changing global politics.
