Dr. Sushrut Jadhav, MBBS, MD, MRCPsych. PhD. is a street psychiatrist and clinician anthropologist in London, UK. He is Associate Professor of Cross-cultural Psychiatry, University College London, UK; Consultant Psychiatrist, Camden Homeless Outreach Services & Islington Mental Health Rehabilitation Services & Lead Clinician, Cultural Consultation Service, Camden and Islington Community Health and Social Care Trust, London, UK. Dr Jadhav is founding and current Editor-in-Chief, Anthropology and Medicine journal (Taylor & Francis, UK). His current applied research interests include mental health dimensions of 'marginal' groups with a focus on South Asia. He has taught and examined extensively on medical anthropology and cultural psychiatry programmes, at several national and international Universities, and was an advisor to DSM 5 Task Force for Cultural Formulation. Dr Jadhav currently supervises UCL doctoral and post-doctoral scholars conducting research on the cultural appropriateness of mental health theory and practice in low-income nations with a specific focus on India. More recently, he is engaged in field testing cultural psychological therapy in India for individuals and groups distressed by their cultural identity.
