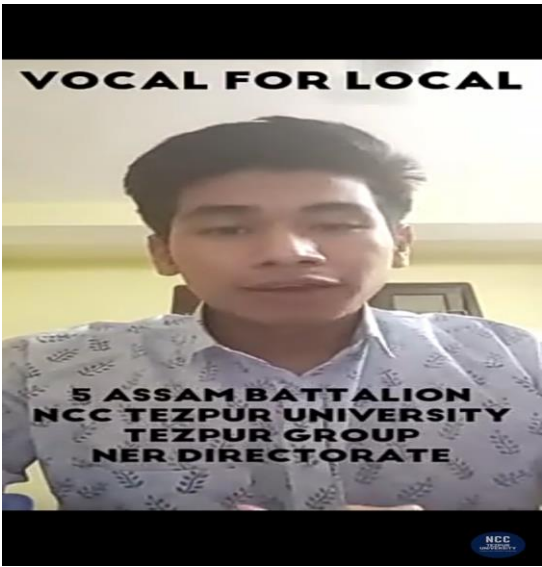

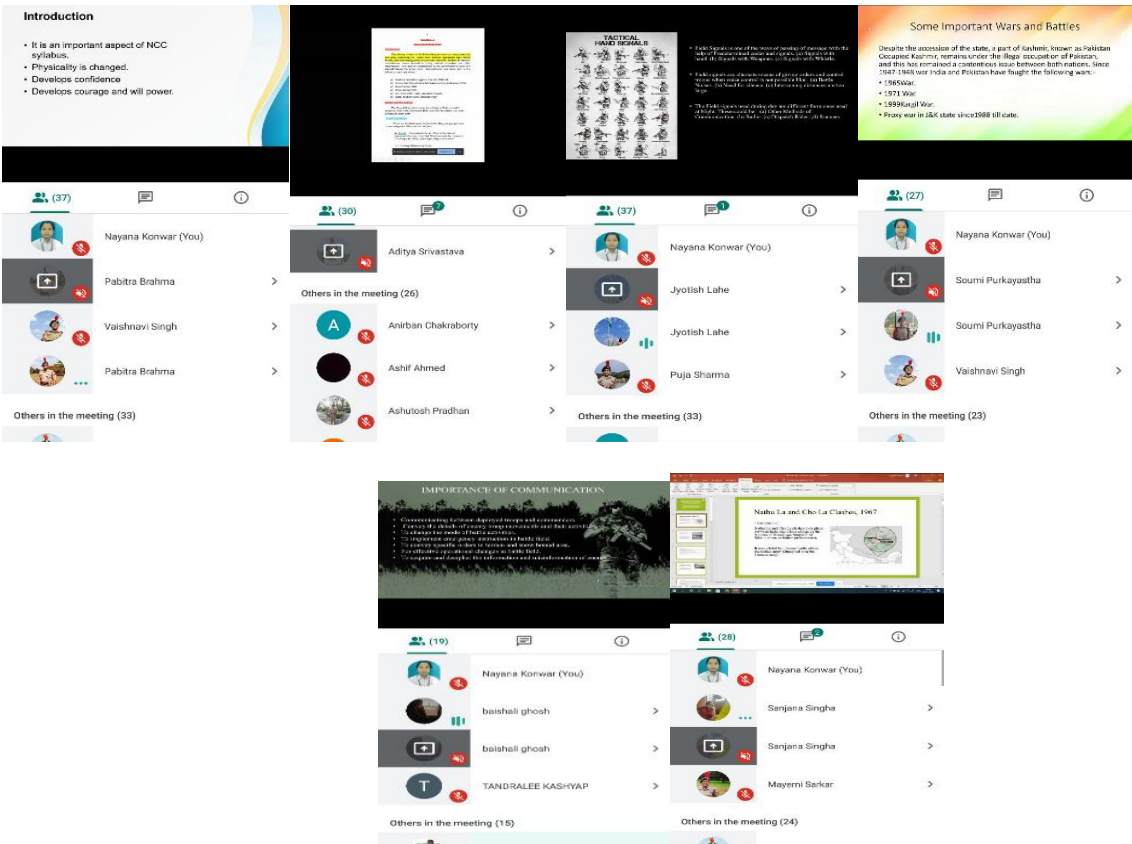

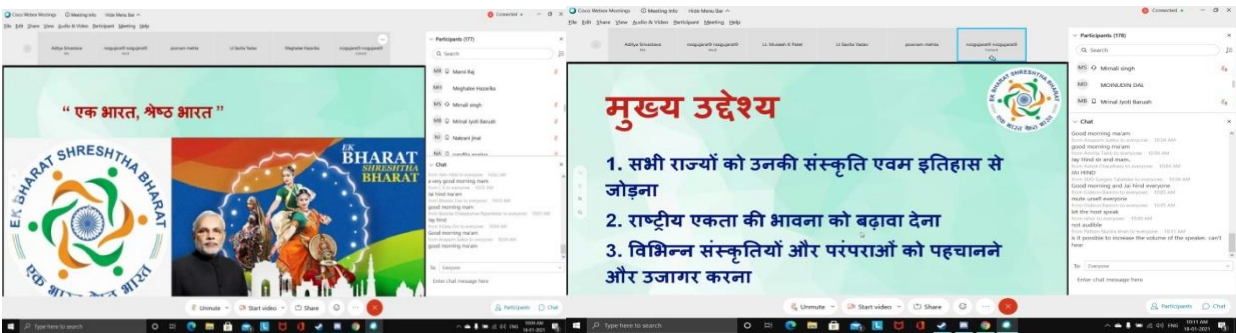
NCC in upcoming years. The series started on 5th January 2021 and ended on 11th February 2021 under our JUO Mandeep Kumar Singh.

Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat was announced by Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi on 31st October 2015 on 140th birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel. It aims to actively enhance interaction among NCC cadets of diverse regions living in different states and units to inculcate mutual understanding between them and develop qualities of leadership, discipline, and integrity.

- **YEP, Selection Camp (31st January to 18th February 2021)**



Youth Exchange Programme is an annually conducted programme that allows NCC cadets from all over India to travel foreign countries as youth ambassadors. A total of more than 100 cadets, who are in their 2nd year of NCC, are selected every year to represent the country. Cadets from each of the 17 Directorates are selected with due procedures having limited quotas for army, navy, and air force. A cadet selected will be able to travel to only one country.



NCC has Youth Exchange Programmes with 11 foreign countries: Singapore, Vietnam, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Nepal, Bhutan, Maldives, Russia, Kazakhstan, Turkmenistan, Kyrgyzstan.

- **Webinar on “Career opportunity in food safety”**

This webinar of food safety was conducted by fssai and the chief guest was a food safety officer who was an ex-army officer, so therefore this webinar was specially for the NCC cadets.

- **CATC for B Certificate (9th March to 11th March 2021)**



CATC stands for Combined Annual Training Camp. Generally, these camps are 14 days long and include a variety of activities including, but not limited to, drill, yoga, sports, PT, theory classes, cultural night, etc. But this year, due to the ongoing pandemic situation, a three-day-long camp was organized for the B-Certificate appearing cadets, from 9th to 11th March at Tezpur Collegiate, Tezpur Assam, with all covid protocols in place. Our day started with roll call and breakfast at 7 am and ended at 4 pm. In addition to breakfast, we were provided snacks, lunch, and dinner as well. The main motto of this camp was to cover the syllabus of the B-Certificate exam. We were divided into groups according to our college and taught separately. The 1st day was pretty much all about the introduction and making us familiar with the camp curriculum. In addition to that, we had our weapon training class where we learned about the .22 rifle (its parts, maintenance, and handling), and then we learned how to read a map. Day 2 focused mainly on drill and Disaster Management training. The 12 NDRF, Itanagar, Arunachal Pradesh Team was invited to brief us about it. While on the 3rd day we summed up the exam syllabus and the day ended with a practice exam to check our preparation level.

- **CATC for C Certificate (9th March to 13th March 2021)**

In NCC Camp training is the practical manifestation of institutional training. The basic aim of Camps is to introduce cadets to a regimented way of life and helps in developing camaraderie, team work, leadership qualities, self-confidence, self-reliance, and dignity of labour in the cadets. The cadets are exposed to the excitement of camp life where they apply the theoretical knowledge that they had gained in Institutional Training.

CATC stands for **Combined Annual Training Camp**. These are held within the State under the aegis of respective NCC Directorates. Generally, these camps are **14 days long** and include a variety of activities including, but not limited to, drill, yoga, sports, PT, theory classes, cultural night, etc. But this year, due to the ongoing pandemic situation, a five-day long day camp was organized for the C-Certificate appearing cadets, from 9th to 13th March 2021 at Tezpur Collegiate, Tezpur Assam, with all covid protocols in place.

- **Blood Donation (4th April 2021)**

‘Give blood and keep the world beating’. A blood donation truly is a ‘gift of life’ that a healthy person can give to others in their community who are sick or injured. It takes less than an hour of one’s time, where a person can donate one unit of blood that can be separated into individual components, which can help save multiple lives.

Our SUO Priotush Paul donated his blood on the following dates:

- 1) 11th February 2018
- 2) 24th February 2019
- 3) 11th October 2019
- 4) 15th August 2020
- 5) 4th April 2021



On 4th April 2021, SUO Priotush Paul was approached with a blood donation request. He instantly volunteered to donate blood to save a life. Chandan Bhatta's mother (the patient) required blood for an emergency surgery. However, she required O +ve blood, which was unavailable at the time in the blood bank, therefore, SUO Priotush Paul travelled to Kanaklata Public Hospital in Tezpur and donated his blood. The patient was cured within a few days.

- **Plogging Event (4th April 2021)**

Plogging is a combination of jogging with picking up litter. It is derived from the Swedish verbs *plocka upp* (pick up) and *jogga* (jog) giving the new Swedish verb *plogga*, from which the word 'plogging' is derived.

On 4th April 2021, cadets of NCC Tezpur University who were present in the Tezpur University campus conducted the plogging event. The thrive and zeal to clean our campus with the element of fitness via jogging is an experience that every one of us enjoyed. The activity not only helps to clean our environment by removing litter from the streets and throwing them in the garbage bins but also includes fun along with enjoyment. During the event, we were quite excited about cleaning our campus. We jogged covering a round of the campus while picking up wrappers, paper wastes, bottles, and other litter wastes and after collection threw them in the university garbage.

- **NCC B CERTIFICATE EXAM (18th April 2021)**

NCC B Certificate is one of the three certificates that a Cadet can have.



The B Certificate exam of 5 Assam Battalion was held at Darrang College, Tezpur, Assam on the 18th of April 2021. Cadets from all the units which are under 5 Assam Battalion came to appear for the examination. We the cadets of NCC Tezpur University were led by our Senior Under Officer Priotush Paul and Under Officer Saugat Deb. Their experience and guidance helped us release a lot of pressure. NCC B certificate exam included a written test which went from around 3 hours which was based on NCC common subject and NCC special subject for army wing. Then there was a practical exam for Weapon Training, Map Reading, and Drill. A total of 20 cadets from NCC Tezpur University appeared in the examination. The exam started at 9 am and went till 3 pm. The whole examination was conducted under the supervision of Commanding Officer Colonel Om Prakash Pandey, ADM officer Lt. Col. Zafrul Korim, PI staffs, and ANOs. The Exam was completed quickly, and we were pleased with our effort, now we await the results. Our university was closed due to the pandemic therefore all of the cadets came from all across Assam and returned safely.

- **IGOT Covid-19 Training (16th May – 18th May 2021)**

This event was based on one of the courses in the 'Integrated Government Online Training (IGOT)' portal on the Ministry of HRD's DIKSHA platform for capacity building of frontline workers to handle the pandemic efficiently and provide medical and essential services on the field for the management of COVID-19.

The NCC has moved to help the civilian authorities by extending the services of its cadets under the program '**Exercise NCC Yogdan.**' The tasks envisaged for cadets include –

- Manning of helpline/call centers
- Distributing relief materials/medicines/food/essential commodities.

- Community assistance, data management, and queue and traffic management.



The online training module consists of videos, audio modules, and frequently asked questions on the different topics related to the volunteering of NCC cadets during this pandemic. The videos are made by cadets of different directorates and from different regions. We have been trained virtually about the basic guidelines to maintain personal safety and hygiene, the norms for working the duty assigned, and the don'ts during the assignment period.

● **World Environment Day Plantation Drive by 5 Assam Battalion (05th June 2021)**

Following up on the successful plantation drive held on NCC Day (November 21, 2020), our SUO Prioutush Paul organized a large-scale plantation drive on **World Environment Day**, under the aegis of our ADM Officer Lt. Col. Zafrul Korim in collaboration with MANGALDAI COLLEGE, T.H.B College, L.O.K.D COLLEGE, DARANG COLLEGE, TEZPUR COLLEGE, CHAIDUAR COLLEGE, BISWANATH COLLEGE, BIHPURIA COLLEGE. After discussing the plan with other SUO's from different colleges and assigning the task to every cadet who was willing to take a part, we managed a large-scale plantation drive on 5th June 2021, in which more than 300 plants have been planted successfully. In the end, we collected pictures and small videos from different locations where planting was initiated and made one combined video which was further uploaded on the official YouTube channel of NCC Tezpur University to make the common people aware of the importance of trees.



Because of the following points, the plantation drive was organized-

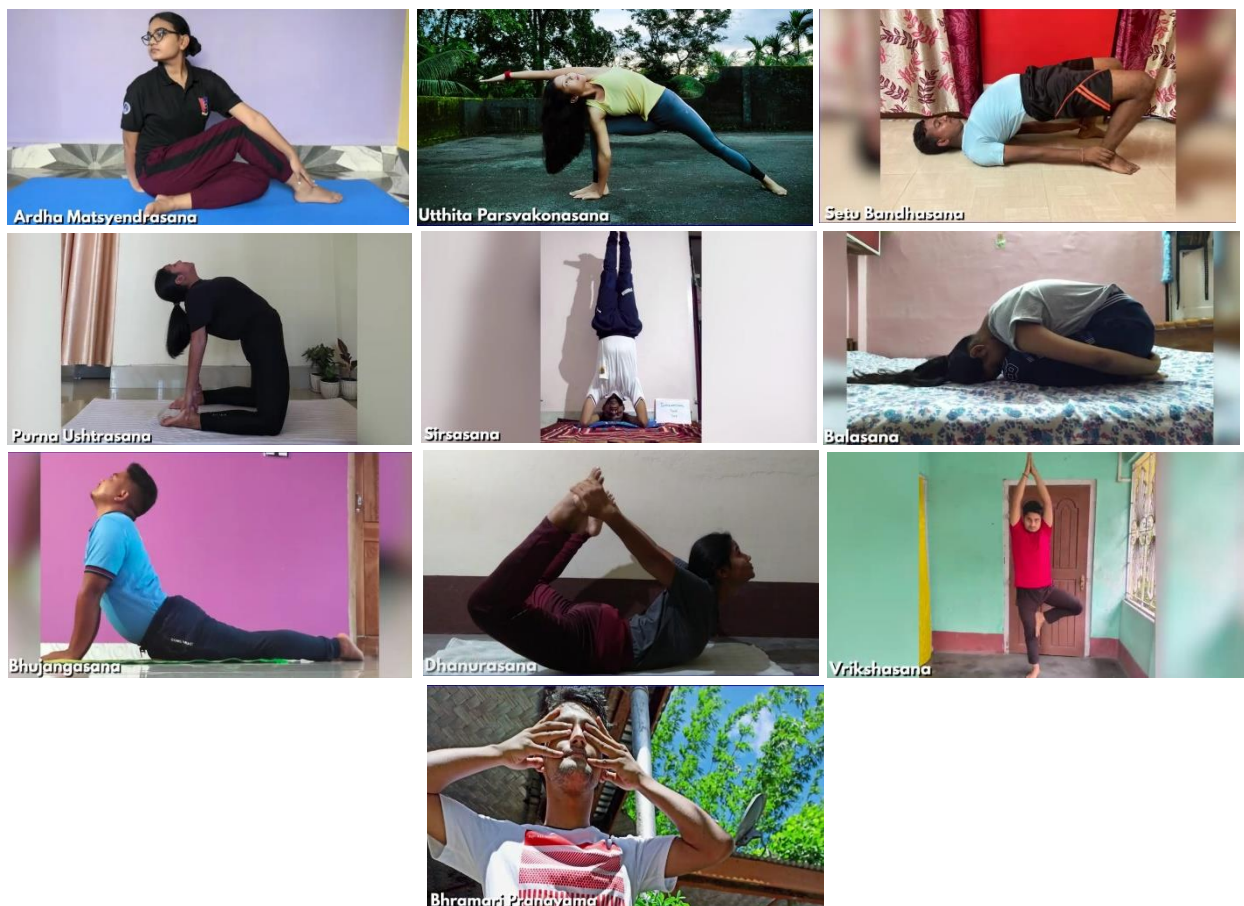
- To set an example for others so that more trees get planted
