The forest guards were also apprised of basic "Do's and Don'ts" in facing the health challenges of working in such remote and forest environment.

The team provided valuable counselling to the forest guards, provided medicines and tried to understand the challenging situation which the guards face on day today basis. A total of 78 forest guards took part in the camp. Baptist Christian Hospital, Tezpur also provided its support by deputing two nurses in the camp.
