Teaching Learning Centre, Tezpur University strives to support and provide the most useful and appropriate resources to learners and teachers in higher education through its various initiatives. As a part of the engagement, the centre aims to create a database of resource links of reference services that can be used to support, guide and enhance teaching learning. Though the initiative has already been started under the TLC scheme, in order to strengthen the database TLC invites Expression of Interest (EOI) from faculty members of Tezpur University to develop E-resource repository. These e-resources will be Open Educational Resources (OER) that are freely available for teachers and students to use, adapt, share, and reuse.

Open Educational Resources (OER) are teaching, learning and research materials in any medium that reside in the public domain or have been released under an open license that permits no-cost access, use, adaptation and redistribution by others.ⁱ
