Support of arts and heritage

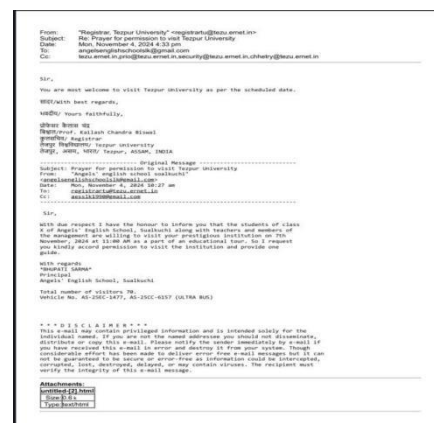
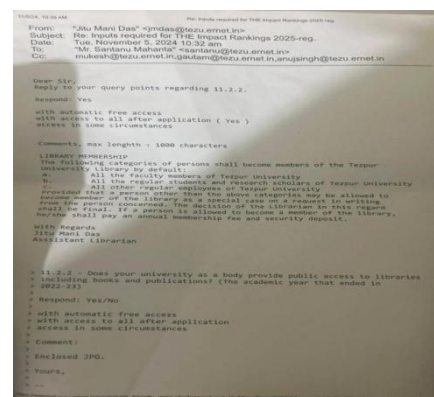
The Neelpawan Baruah Museum of Modern Art at Tezpur University showcases modern art, with a focus on the works of Assamese artist Neelpawan Baruah. It features a collection of paintings and other visual arts reflecting both traditional and contemporary influences.

The Cultural Interpretation Centre at Tezpur University, part of the Department of Cultural Studies, focuses on preserving and promoting the diverse cultural heritage of the region. It offers research, exhibitions, and programs that explore local traditions, arts, and socio-cultural issues, fostering academic and community engagement with cultural diversity.

The following categories of persons shall become members of the Tezpur University Library by default:

- All the faculty members of Tezpur University
- All the regular students and research scholars of Tezpur University
- All other regular employees of Tezpur University

Provided that a person other than the above categories may be allowed to become member of the library as a special case on a request in writing from the person concerned. The decision of the Librarian in this regard shall be final. If a person is allowed to become a member of the library, he/she shall pay an annual membership fee and security deposit.

Sustainable practices

Tezpur University has a policy that restricts students from using motorized vehicles on campus to help control pollution. It may also promote initiatives like walking, cycling. It provides affordable housing for its employees, including faculty and staff quarters on campus and also provides affordable hostel accommodation for students. Hostels are available for both male and female students and are located on campus.

Tezpur University's growth and development have an impact on local infrastructure and housing needs, especially as the university attracts staff, students, and other stakeholders to the area.

An Electricity Neutral Building (ENB) or Net Zero Electricity Building (nZEB) is a building that consumes no more electricity than it generates from renewable energy sources on-site over the course of a year. The aim is for these buildings to produce fewer greenhouse gas emissions during operation compared to traditional, non-nZEB buildings. Several departments and hostels at the university are designed to meet the standards of ENB or nZEB.
